**Status:** Common.

*Eremias kopetdaghica* SZCZERBAK, 1972

Kopet Dagh Racerunner

**Global range:** Iran and Turkmenistan.

**Distribution in Iran:** Provinces of Golestan, North Khorasan, Razavi Khorasan, and Semnan.

**Biology:** The Kopet Dagh Racerunner is observed in piedmont areas covered with scattered stones and rocks. The dominant vegetation in the habitat of this species includes bushes such as *Astragalus* and *Artemisia*. Unlike *E. persica*, this species climbs on steep sides of rocks and boulders.

**Size:** Snout–vent length 68 mm, tail length 122 mm.

**Reproduction:** Oviparous.

**Status:** Common.

**Conservation status:** IUCN: –, CITES: –, National: Non-protected.

**Diet:** Arachnids and insects.

**Activity pattern:** Diurnal.
